

Dear Year 11 Parents and Carers

Year 11 Full Report 2024

Please find attached the Year 11 Full Report.

We ask parents and carers to discuss this report with students and ensure that any appropriate action regarding attitude to learning, including homework, is taken. The information below should help with understanding the report.

GCSE Trial Exams Two - Grade

Teachers have recorded a Grade 9-1 to show how the student did in their second trial exam, November of Year 11. If a subject did not have an exam at this time "n/a" has been entered. Please note that this is **not** a predicted grade, it is the grade achieved in a trial exam which covers part of the full GCSE course giving an indication of performance in that subject.

Some subjects, for example, PE, Drama and DT, have a practical element (a non-examined assessment, NEA) that counts towards the student's final overall grade. It is therefore important to point out that performance in the written examination, as indicated in the trial exam, is only one aspect of the overall GCSE assessment process in these subjects.

Progress

This is a judgement made by the teacher about whether a student has made the progress expected of them in that subject up to this point.

1	Exceptional progress	Excellent progress. Securely meeting target grade or exceeding expected target
2	Expected progress	Good progress On target
3	Below target	Not making expected progress at this stage, a little below target Possible to improve progress with suggested actions
4	Concern about progress	Significant concern about a student's progress, for example, they are currently a long way from their target grade

The Red, Amber and Green is not a judgement of the student but it is an alert about their progress.

At this point there is still time for students to make a substantial difference to their level of progress so they should be speaking with their teachers to clarify actions and next steps.

With further assessments planned, including Trial Exams Three in March, we will continue to monitor each student's progress in all of their subjects.

Target GCSE Grade

This grade is intended to provide an indication of the potential GCSE grade (9-1) the student is capable of achieving. This target is based on their ability in an individual subject and is generated from their previous achievements.

Our target grades reflect our ambition for our students but they are not a GCSE prediction.

The table below provides some guidance to help understand the grading system.
