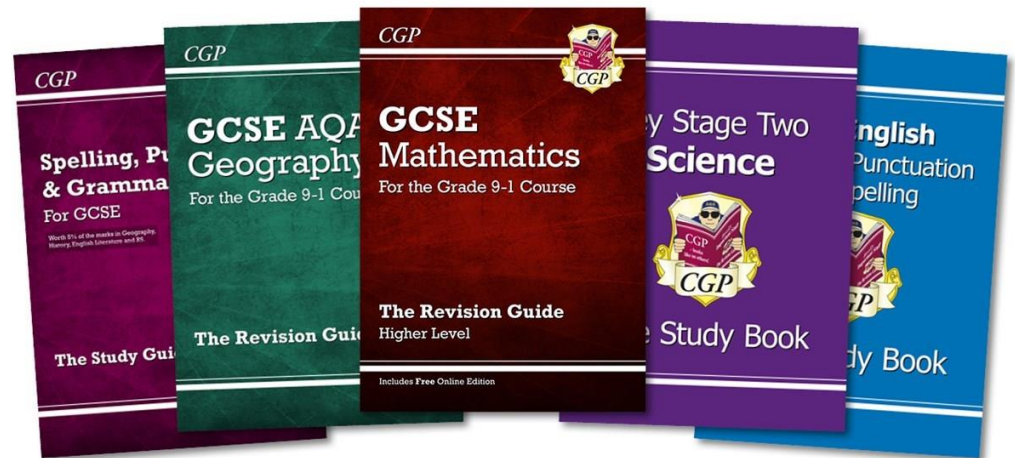

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9-1 Maths GCSE

- ▶ **First examined June 2017**
- ▶ **Graded 9-1, with 9 being the highest. Currently approximately 3.5% of those who take the GCSE**
- ▶ **Still Higher and Foundation tiers**
- ▶ **Sets 1 & 2 Higher Grades 9-5**
- ▶ **Sets 3-5 Foundation Grades 5-1**

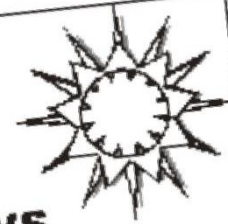
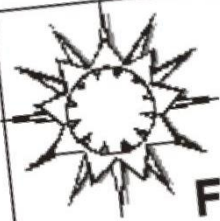
- ▶ **A-level Entry requirement is a Grade 7**
- ▶ **Level 3 Maths in Context requirement is a Grade 5**

Key points:

1. **Three 90 minute exam papers**
2. **One non-calculator paper**
3. **Multiple choice questions have been removed**
4. **Adapted to focus primarily on solving problems that require clear, multi-step solutions to be shown**
5. **Maths is still tiered with an 'improved overlapping tiers model', with a foundation tier covering grades 1-5 and a higher tier covering grades 4–9**
6. **GCSE re-sit opportunities are in November for those staying into 6th Form at Beaminster**
7. **Increased focus on ratio and proportion on the advise of the Business Sector**
8. **Students will be expected to learn key mathematical formulae and be able to recall then apply these**

GCSE Combined Science Trilogy over 2 years.	<p>All 6 Trilogy Science Exams will be assessed May/June 2026.</p> <p>There will be 2 Biology exams, 2 Chemistry exams & 2 Physics exams.</p> <p>All exams are available in foundation or higher, but no mixed entry.</p> <p>All exams will be 1¼ hrs, 70 marks and worth 16.7% of the final grades.</p>
3 Science GCSEs (Separate Sciences) Biology, Chemistry & Physics.	<p>Each Science will be assessed in May/June 2026.</p> <p>Each Science will have 2 exams.</p> <p>All exams are available in foundation or higher, but no mixed entry within a singular science.</p> <p>All exams will be 1¾ hrs, 100 marks and worth 50% of the final grade for that science.</p>

Tier of Entry

Choosing a student's tier of entry is an extremely hard challenge for teachers and students.

Higher tier papers allow students to access grades 9 to 4.

Foundation tier papers allow students to access grades 5 to 1

Therefore in order for a student to be entered for higher tier papers teachers will look for a track record of regularly attaining grade 5s or more in assessments.

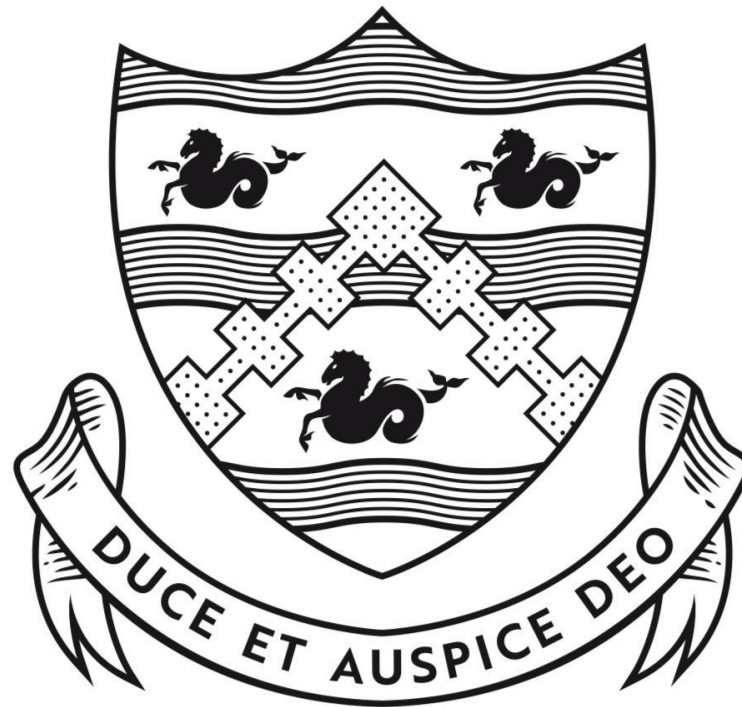

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Important things to remember

- **The exam board for all science courses is AQA.**
- There are 2 courses: **Separate Sciences & Trilogy.**
- **All students cover the same units**, but the separate science students will go into more depth in some units.
- **All examinations** are at the **end of Year 11.** (No Coursework)
- Each student should ideally have the correct **revision guide** for their course.
- **Revision/help sessions** are available. See your teachers and ask! Prior to mock exams Thursday lunch sessions.

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Be Prepared

- ▶ Know WHAT you need to know
- ▶ Know WHEN you need to know it
- ▶ Know that you KNOW it
 - ▶ Revisit, Review, Revise
- ▶ Know HOW to use it - practise
- ▶ Know WHERE to get help
 - ▶ “If in doubt – shout!”
 - ▶ No problem is insurmountable
 - ▶ Talk to tutors and subject teachers
 - ▶ Take up offers of help

How will you do?

- ▶ If you have the right attitude, work hard and push yourself then the grades will take care of themselves
- ▶ **Target grades**
 - ▶ Give an indication of where you should be aiming.
 - ▶ They are based on prior attainment and 'expected' outcomes.
 - ▶ They are realistically ambitious.
 - ▶ They are NOT a prediction.
 - ▶ They are NOT a ceiling to what you can achieve.
- ▶ **3 sets of trial exams**

Attendance

- ▶ **There is a direct relationship between attendance and final GCSE results**
- ▶ **One day off per week = 80% attendance**
- ▶ **DfE research shows that when attendance falls to 90% a pupil will have dropped a grade in their GCSE results.**
- ▶ **Absence means missing key content, support and coursework.**

Keep Stress to a Manageable Level

- ▶ **Stress is normal**
- ▶ **You may think that you are alone in facing the pressures of this year**
- ▶ **You aren't – so don't be afraid to ask for help**
- ▶ **Tell teachers about any worries or if you don't understand something**
- ▶ **Parents and Carers, please contact us early if you have any concerns**
- ▶ **Be prepared – practise. Mock exams.**
