Firstly, the **House Matches** were, as always, a real success with lots of participation and plenty of fierce competition in the Girls' Football and Boys' Badminton. Lewesdon have taken back the lead and are now 4 points ahead, followed narrowly by Mapperton and then Eggardon.

On Tuesday our **Year 7 Netballers** did very well down at Budmouth in some very wet and windy conditions. They played a total of 7 matches, winning against All Saints (7-0), St Mary's (3-2) and Wey Valley (4-1), drawing 1 game and losing 3. A cracking effort for their first ever tournament, finishing 4<sup>th</sup> out of 8, and a very proud Miss Lewis, as ever. The **Year 10 Netball team** competed in their Area tournament on Thursday finishing a fantastic third place and, as a result, have qualified for the Dorset County Finals. They had some big wins including 16-0 against Atlantic, 7-0 against Wey Valley and 5-0 against Colfox. A special mention to Year 9, Tilly Grave, who stepped up and absolutely held her own against some very strong Year 10s.

The **Year 7 boys** struggled in the first half of their football game against Stanchester on Wednesday, going down 5-0 at half-time. However, a re-shaped team won the second half 1-0, which Mr Hobby is taking as a draw! The **Year 10 team** played in a very similar manner against All Saints, quickly going three down before recovering in the second half to pull back to 3-2.

On the **Hockey** front, our **Year 7 and 8 team** showed real promise, putting their training into practise and winning their very first fixture against Colfox. Year 9 and 10 took an early lead against Colfox and prevented them from forming any strong attacking phases for much of the game, but lost a little focus to concede some quick goals and go 4-1 down, before rallying well at the end. Player of the match was Erin Thompson, who was picked by the opposition for her outstanding play. **Hockey club** continues after school on Thursdays and new players are always welcome.

The **GCSE Music** students in Year 10 and 11 visited Westlands entertainment centre on Wednesday morning to hear the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra musicians performing and discussing some of the set works the students learn about as part of their course. The morning was very engaging and informative and enjoyed by all, and has already inspired some composition work in class!
